SEALED AND BOUND BY BLOOD

Through the centuries, poets and painters have used their talents to give artful expression to the mystery we celebrate this weekend. Representations of Jesus and His disciples at the Last Supper abound. Numerous poems and hymns recount the sacrifice of Jesus and the meal that remembers and celebrates that gift.

One especially poignant representation emerged in the 14th century in Florence, Italy. Hung in the Florence Art Gallery, the painting by Pacino is titled "Tree of Life." It depicts the crucifixion of Jesus as on a tree, the twelve branches of which are hung with circular illustrations of the significant moments of the Christ-event. At the top of the painting, viewers might be surprised to see a mother pelican feeding her young. This image is coated in a pre-Christian legend that during a time of famine or drought, a mother pelican would wound herself, striking at her breast with her beak in order to nourish her brood and stave off their starvation.

Indeed, all through both Testaments, there is ample evidence that blood was regarded as sacred and was appreciated as essential to life and the exclusive property of God, Who is the author of life. Because of its sacred character, blood figured very importantly in the relationship that Israel was so privileged to share with God. While the Israelites were enslaved among the Egyptians, blood on the doorposts and lintels of the Israelites' homes served as a sign of protection and delivered them from death. After being led to freedom and to a future that held out the hope of a land of their own, the people of Israel sealed their new relationship with God with the blood of sacrificed animals. Blood splashed on the altar as well as on the people, served as a blood pact, sealing the covenant. Such an action implied that those bound to one another by this covenant of blood would rather die than breach their relationship in any way. However, as history attests, the Mosaic covenant was broken repeatedly. Nevertheless, and due to God's great and generous mercies, the covenant was also renewed repeatedly; that is until the covenant made between God and all of humankind in Jesus Christ.

Christians believe that because of the blood covenant forged by the sacrifice of Jesus, all other covenants have paled in significance. St. Paul stresses the consequences of the blood pact made by Jesus. Appealing to fellow Jewish believers in Jesus who were growing less than fervent in their faith, St. Paul affirmed Jesus' role as high priest, as the once-for-all perfect sacrifice, as the mediator of a new covenant sealed with His blood.

St. Mark, in the gospel, narrates with dramatic and profound simplicity, the beauty of the solemnity we celebrate. He tells us that Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it, aware that His very self would soon be taken, broken, and given so that sinners would be blessed with healing and forgiveness. At every Eucharist, the narrative is remembered; Jesus' actions are repeated and believers enter anew into the true dimension of Jesus' gift. Rooted in the pact (the sacrifice of the cross), alive in the present (the gift of His very self as real food and real drink), and offering a taste of the future (the anticipation of the liturgy of eternity), this holy memorial is the source of our strength and unity and the sustenance that feeds our faith, fires our hope, and inspires our love.

On June 18th at 7pm, Dr. Monique Ruberu, a local ob/gyn trained in advanced Natural Family Planning techniques, will speak and share a short, powerful documentary film called NaPro, A Woman's Alternative.
