

From the Desk of Father Jon...

Today we celebrate the triumphant arrival of Jesus in to Jerusalem. The King enters His city. This scene must have been extraordinary to behold for those who viewed Christ's arrival that first Palm Sunday. But it presents us with choices that we always need to keep foremost in our minds as Catholics. Are we leaders of Christ, indifferent to Christ, or followers of Christ?

When the cheering commences some people stand off to the side to allow this strange procession to pass by before they go about their business. They are indifferent to the man riding a donkey. He has no impact on their lives.

Then, as Jesus enters Jerusalem, the cheering throngs cast palm branches before Him rolling out the red carpet for their Savior. Doubtless many of these people would like to lead Jesus where they want him to go by laying out a path in palm. So many people had their own expectations of Jesus and His role that they do not get what they want. We hear on Good Friday that those who shouted "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord" on Sunday, are now yelling "crucify Him" on Friday. They do not follow Christ - they lead Him. And when He shows His will to be opposite of theirs, the love they professed turns to hatred.

My friends, we should always remember that we are followers of Christ. We go where the Master leads us, not the other way around. Palm branches and the donkey are a show of the humility of Jesus Christ. And that is the virtue we should exemplify in our own lives. It is the virtue of the follower who knows Christ Jesus will lead us by the path we are called by God to follow.

So as we now begin our Holiest Week of the Year, let us begin this Palm Sunday by taking a handful of humility (the palm) as a sign of desire to grow as followers of Christ.

The Bishops of the U.S. prescribe, as minimal obligations, that all persons **14 years and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.** All persons 18 years and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to **fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Good Friday while the other two meals on those days are to be light.**



ADULT FAITH FORMATION

In this Year of Mercy, we all have the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence more often.

A plenary indulgence is a remission before God of ALL temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

To gain a plenary indulgence, a person must exclude all attachment to sin of any kind, even venial sin, must perform the work or say the prayer for which the indulgence is granted, and must also fulfill the three conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and praying for the intentions of the Pope.

Some 'works' for the Year of Mercy include: passing through the Holy Door (many parishes and the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul in Phila. have one (including St. Katharine Drexel Shrine in Bensalem); for the sick, living their illness with joyful hope and closeness to the Lord; performing the spiritual and corporal works of mercy (listed last week); for the deceased; for all women who have had an abortion.

Imagine - relieved of ALL punishment of ANY sin committed throughout your life.

Holy Door Locations: Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul; Shrine of St. Rita Cascia; Shrine of St. John Neumann; Shrine of St. Katharine Drexel; Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa; Shrine of Miraculous Medal; some local parishes.

Our Lenten music selections reflect the major themes of the season of Lent: prayer, fasting, mercy, and making whole our lives. As Jesus is tempted in the desert and refuses to give in, so must we avoid temptation. As Jesus is transfigured before his apostles, so must we move ourselves closer to the image of God that we get to know through Jesus.

"From Ashes to the Living Font" (#474) utilizes the melody from "Lord, Who Throughout These 40 Days," giving us the flexibility to sing a verse that matches the day's Gospel reading. "Change Our Hearts" (#493) is a powerful reminder that we must use these 40 days of repentance to make sure that we have our hearts in the right direction. "Merciful God" (#489) is a reminder that our salvation comes from God alone. The refrain has three options: one specifically for Ash Wednesday, one for gathering, and one for communion.

Our Mass setting this Lenten season is Mass of Joy and Peace, found in the hymnal #209, #211, #212, #215, and #216.
