

## REVISITING OUR BAPTISM

A mere seven weeks ago thousands of new Church members were baptized. Their new life in Christ has once again infused new life into the Church. Their new-found faith has inspired and bolstered the faith of those who have followed Christ for many years. As the Easter season nears its end, we revisit the scene of our baptisms. In the second reading we hear Christ calling us:

"Come. . . Let . . . the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water" (Revelation 22:17).

But our baptism is not one of water only. John refers to washed robes, and we know that this washing is to be "in the blood of the Lamb." To make sure we get this message, we have today's first reading from Acts. It is the story of Stephen, the first Christian to be killed for his faith in Jesus. We remember the promise and also the cost of being a disciple of Christ.

All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00am Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.


### From the Administrator's Desk...

Last week we looked at the S word of ACTS: *Supplication* or “asking for”. Whatever jam we’re in, we turn spontaneously to God. There are no atheists in fox holes. Equally, long-standing wishes, hurts, and disappointments keep the “please God” spigot running. Mature prayer of supplication, as I hope to clarify, logically follows on Adoration and Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving. *The key*. In both the Common and Christian Scriptures, *recognition* of what God has done and is doing for us is the basis of all praying and living. Open your eyes. Count your blessings. Behold the sky, the tree, the child, health, recovery, security, food on the table – the list is unending. Behold WHO provides it all. Then, there are the conversions, the resolution of conflicts that bring us to our knees in recognition, in gratitude, in worship.

Years ago, a trip to Greece turned out to be the perfect travel storm. Hardly the horrors St. Paul experienced in his missionary journeys, and not the fault of the country or its citizens; but if it could go wrong, it did! Finally: Athens where we were taken to the most accommodating restaurant ever. “How can I thank these people,” I asked myself, not being conversant in modern Greek. “Well, you do know some classical and biblical Greek, Dummy,” said I to me. “So, look at the sign in red lights over the exit that reads ‘*exodos* (in Greek Script). Hey! That’s the title of the second Book of the Bible: Exodus, which means *exit!*” Finally, the brain got into gear: “And our word *Eucharist* derives from the Greek ‘*eucharistia*, which means “thanksgiving”, doesn’t it? Put it into verb form, and you’ll get ‘*euxaristo* and be able to thank these life-saving people decently.

Yes. Thanksgiving is our fullest prayer. And where do we experience it most perfectly? In Mass, of course, the model for all gratitude to God and neighbor. Think of the “last discourse” in St. John’s Gospel, we’ve been hearing this Easter Time. These five chapters unfold the *meaning and implications* of the Holy Eucharist – almost a quarter of his entire Gospel! Add to that, his Chapter 6 for his specific teaching on the change of ordinary food and drink into the supersubstantial food and drink of his Body and Blood! As we humbly eat and drink, so do we break bread and pour forth his chalice in our daily lives. Truly, he calls us to give thanks and to live lives of thanksgiving.

## ST. IGNATIUS FISCAL CORNER

One of the issues brought to our attention during our recent feasibility study was transparency of the parish finances. We hope this "Fiscal Corner" will help to answer those questions and give a greater understanding of the parish finances to our parishioners. A common question asked was, how much do we owe on our parish debt, and why do we have one. On June 30<sup>th</sup> 2016 the balance of our debt to the Archdiocese will include principal owed on the loan for the building of the parish center (\$607,848), overdue interest on that loan (\$421,473) and back parish assessment (\$603,836) for a total of \$1,633,157. With the sale of the land, we will be able to reduce that amount to under \$1,000,000, but we will still owe a significant amount of money. This was due to assessments and loan payments that were not paid over the years. It was a decision to use our limited resources for our parish ministries and for religious education. The plan was to address the debt with the sale of the extra piece of property the parish owns. Unfortunately, due to the timing of the sale, and the dip in the real estate market, the original plan to pay the entire debt with those proceeds, was no longer a possibility. We realize we must meet our obligations to the broader church of the Archdiocese and are working to reduce, if not eliminate our debt to keep our parish financially secure. Next week we will take a closer look at our Sunday contributions over the years and how we compare to our surrounding parishes. 
