

ST. IGNATIUS FISCAL CORNER

This week we will take a quick look at Sunday collections. The latest Weekly collections, as reported by area parishes for were as follows: Queen of the Universe - \$20,365; St. Frances Cabrini - \$19,524; St. John the Evangelist - \$17,390; and Holy Trinity - \$10,208. These totals include electronic giving. For the period July 2016 through October 2016, our collections, including electronic giving, totaled \$280,176. Our weekly average for this period is \$15,565. We had anticipated \$16,375 per week in our budget, so as you can see we are a bit behind. Over the years, St. Ignatius averaged \$20,000 per week from 2005 to 2009, and \$18,000 per week from 2010 to 2015. As you can see, it is a significant reduction in income and it is a driving factor that contributes to our fiscal shortfalls. While we are able to keep current with all of our bills, including our Archdiocesan obligations, we are unable to pay down any previously accumulated debt. Sunday contributions are the number one source of income for our parish and we are thankful and extremely grateful to our parishioners for their financial support. Your weekly gifts help St. Ignatius to fulfill its mission. As a reminder, our parish appeal is currently underway. This is another critical source of income for our parish and we hope you can support our effort. Thank you for your continued support of St. Ignatius! “A model of care has been developed specifically for families whose infant is likely to die before or after birth. Often called ‘perinatal hospice,’ ...[it] provides precious moments together—whether the baby is inside or outside the womb— which can be cherished forever.”

Perinatal hospice is traditional hospice for babies in the womb who have a fatal diagnosis or a malformation incompatible with life. The programs starts with support of the parents while the baby is in utero and continues through natural delivery of the child and immediate loving and tender respectful care of the child and their parents through the child's death and burial. It is a beautiful and comforting way of approaching perinatal poor outcome diagnoses without aborting the child, which is a type of mercy-killing.
