The Archdiocese of Philadelphia announced that Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez has suspended all public Masses in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia until further notice. The Archbishop dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Both decisions were made in response to the growing concern over the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the directives provided by government and health department officials at the local, state, and national levels. These measures will be re-evaluated pending future developments. FISCAL CORNER

We would like to take this opportunity to give you a status of our Sunday Collection totals during this shutdown. For the period March 18 to April 19, 2019 our collections totaled \$127,464. For the same period this year, during the shutdown, our collections totaled \$79,235. As you can see, we have seen a decrease in our Sunday collections of \$48,229, or 37.84%. Our Easter collection last year totaled \$51,048. To date we have collected \$26,532 towards our Easter collection. Again, as you can see, we have seen a decrease of \$24,516 or 48.03% for Easter. To date, we are behind 40.75% in our parish collections or \$72,745 in total revenues.

It is amazing that so many of you have come through and continued your financial support for our parish. We are extremely grateful for all of you who have continued to support St. Ignatius during this difficult financial period. We would like to once again say THANK YOU to all who continue to support our parish financially during this nationwide health emergency.

Third Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts 2: 14, 22-23

Here is the core teaching message of the early Church used by her missionary Apostles. It is a short summary of Our Lord's works, death and resurrection.

Reading II: I Peter 1: 17-21

Christ's blood releases us from the power of sin. You must be holy because of this incomparable gift.

The Gospel: Luke 24: 13-35

A wonderful meeting of two disheartened disciples (representing all of us) with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. The scenario ends with a Eucharistic liturgy: there is a Scripture reading followed by an explanation, capped off by the breaking of the bread before Jesus vanishes.



My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.

Religious Education

From the Religious Education Office ... The PREP office is closed because of the Coronavirus but is usually open from Sundays (after the 9:30 a.m. Mass) through Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. on.

SACRAMENTS:

FIRST COMMUNION: First Communion Day has been rescheduled to Saturday, June 6. The 9:30 a.m. Mass is for St. Ignatius School and

Wednesday PREP children. The 12:00 noon Mass is for Sunday and Monday PREP children. If this works out, there will be a rehearsal for each group from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. during the week leading up to the 6th of June.

CONFIRMATION: The Archdiocese has cancelled all May and June Confirmations because of the Coronavirus. We will let you know as soon as possible when we hear the new date. There will be a rehearsal for candidates and sponsors on one evening during the week leading up to Confirmation. You can still mail in your gift to the Bishop for his favorite charity. VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL CAMP: All St. Ignatius School children and all PREP children, who will be entering grades K to 5 in the 2020 – 2021 school year, received the VBS Registration Form in early March. Our VBS program this year is Rocky Railway – Jesus' power pulls us through (how appropriate for these days). The fee is \$50 per child, and the children receive a snack every day, a music CD, Bible Buddies, etc. Vacation Bible School Camp is scheduled for June 22 to June 26, 2020. We need some volunteers – adults and kids from age 12 and up – to help us out. Please consider volunteering. It is a great week! As of this printing, VBS is still happening.

PREP REGISTRATION for the 2020 – 2021 school year has begun. Early PREP Registration continues until June 30. PREP (Parish Religious Education Program) is for children in Grades K to 8. There is no increase in tuition this coming year. All PREP families have received the Registration Form by email. If anyone needs the Registration Form, please go to the Parish website and click on PREP. Please list all of your children on the same form since the form has been revised. You can mail in registrations and fees to the rectory to Annmarie's attention.

Special Needs: Parents, are you aware that we have a PREP class for students with special needs? This class meets on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. If we could help to give your child a religious education in a small group environment, please call Annmarie at 215-493-5204.


CARING FOR FRIENDS (formerly Aid for Friends)

Pastoral Care and Formation Resource Through the Permanent Diaconate: BIOETHICS AND LIFE QUESTIONS



With the approval of the Archbishop, a group of Permanent Deacons of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia has been trained and certified to offer pastoral counseling and formation in the area of bioethics focusing on beginning and end of life issues. This group of deacons is available as a resource to parishes and other institutions. They are certified to offer:

- **PASTORAL COUNSELING** to individuals and families who are facing medical issues that require ethical decision-making. This includes end of life question, poor pre-natal diagnoses, or couples facing infertility issues.
- **PRESENTATIONS** on areas of Catholic bioethics with a special focus on end of life decisions, including a 40-minute PowerPoint presentation “End of Life Decisions: A Catholic Perspective”

TOPICS OF EXPERTISE

The Archdiocese’s team of bioethics-certified deacons is equipped to address a broad area of subjects including but not limited to:

- extraordinary medical care
- physician assisted euthanasia
- abortion
- stem cell research
- genetic engineering
- organ donation
- poor Pre-Natal diagnoses
- adolescent decision-making


