

Faith Formation

This past week we celebrated the feast of St. Maximillian Kolbe. Most know the story about how he offered himself for death over another prisoner with family and how he led those who were to die with him in prayer, song, and praise until death. He is the patron saint of drug addicts, prisoners, families, and the pro-life movement. He died Aug. 14, 1941. He is also known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary as he was strongly influenced by a vision he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12!. After his martyrdom his body was cremated on the feast of the Assumption of Our Lady. We also celebrated the feast of the Assumption of Our Lady. Many postulate that Mary never suffered the wages of sin, i.e. death, but was thought to be dead (actually, in a state of dormition) and when the Apostles went to prepare for her funeral her body and soul were 'assumed' into heaven. Since Mary was without sin, there was no reason for her to suffer death. Finally, we also celebrated the feast day of St. Stephen of Hungary. King St. Stephen was the first King of Hungary around 1000 AD. He worked throughout his Kingship to establish the Church in Hungary and his feast day is also a national holiday in that country.

While many of these saints have remarkable stories and are great examples to all of us, we are ALL called to be saints. So, what is a saint: 'a person acknowledged as holy or virtuous and typically regarded as being in heaven after death.' Are we 'working' toward sainthood? Are we holy or virtuous? Will we be in heaven after death? These are all questions that we should ask ourselves and then find out what it is that God is calling us to do for His Kingdom here on earth...and then 'just DO IT'!

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.



"In times of suffering, the human person should be able to experience a solidarity and a love that takes on the suffering, offering a sense of life that extends beyond death... In the family a person can count on strong relationships, valued in themselves apart from their helpfulness or the joy they bring. It is essential that the sick under care do not feel themselves to be a burden, but can sense the intimacy and support of their loved ones" (SB 4-5). Let us reflect on how Mary supported Jesus in His ministry, suffering, death and Resurrection. She is the epitome of love and acceptance of suffering. On August 15 we honor her Assumption into her Heavenly Queenship as Mother of God and Queen of Angels and Mother of our Church here on earth. Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ'" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, In Luc., 10, 121: PL 15 1834A.).

Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

Intercessory Prayer: For those who are gravely ill or dying: May our Blessed Mother ease their pain and fears, and by her glorious Assumption, console them with the hope of eternal life; We pray to the Lord.

We would appreciate that all registrations be turned in by August 31st in order to give us enough time to order textbooks and resource materials before PREP begins on September 8th. Registration forms are available on the St. Ignatius Church Website. Look under PREP and then scroll down to Registration Form 2024-2025. You can also obtain a registration form from the PREP office or the rectory. PREP tuition is \$275 for one child, \$525 for two children, and \$750 for three or more children.

Our Outdoor Columbarium Niches located in the memorial circle in the center of our cemetery are now available for sale.

Granite Front Double Niche: A space within a columbarium designed for the entombment of two cremated remains. Double granite front niches are intended to be used by two cremated remains of two persons behind a marble shutter. Maximum usable space of 11.5 inches by 11.5 inches by 13.5 inches. The urn will not be visible. A standard plaque can be purchased for \$425 at the time of sale of the niche, or at market price at the time of interment of Cremated Remains. Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services: \$3,200 The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday – Friday: \$550 Saturday: \$700
