

Reading I: 1 Samuel 1: 20-22, 24-28

With reminders of Sarah's situation, the story of Hannah is again that of the barren woman once scorned. She also gives her child back to God.

Reading II: 1 John 3: 1-2, 21-24

Being "God's children now," urges us to realize that we do not belong to this world, which has rejected Christ. In the next life, we shall see God "as He is."

The Gospel: Luke 2: 41-52



Granite Front Double Niche: A space within a columbarium designed for the entombment of two cremated remains. Double granite front niches are intended to be used by two cremated remains of two persons behind a marble shutter. Maximum usable space of 11.5 inches by 11.5 inches by 13.5 inches. The urn will not be visible.

A standard plaque can be purchased for \$425 at the time of sale of the niche, or at market price at the time of interment of Cremated Remains. Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services: \$3,200
