


Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week, in addition to celebrating the feast of St. James, also celebrates the feast day of Sts. Anne and Joachim, grandparents of Jesus and parents of Mary, the Mother of God. Natural Family Planning is taught around the world by many organizations with Couple to Couple League being the largest in the U.S. The lessons on learning NFP are backed by scientific research and proven by results that not only allow postponing having children, but also help to facilitate conceiving children. Granite Front Double Niche: A space within a columbarium designed for the entombment of two cremated remains. Double granite front niches are intended to be used by two cremated remains of two persons behind a marble shutter. Maximum usable space of 11.5 inches by 11.5 inches by 13.5 inches. The urn will not be visible.

A standard plaque can be purchased for \$425 at the time of sale of the niche, or at market price at the time of interment of Cremated Remains.

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services: \$3,200
