The month of April is typically dedicated to the Holy Spirit, the "Lord, the Giver of life" as we profess in our Creed every Sunday. Since we are in Lent and the liturgical colors are still purple it is appropriate that same color is associated with penance, mortification, and the sorrow of the contrite heart. Many hear of celebrations of "life in the Spirit" and really do not understand exactly what that means, or even who is this third person of the Trinity. Many can easily identify with God, the Father and Jesus, His Son as they are very prominently mentioned in the Bible and Scripture readings. The Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son and is often described as a divine person wo guides, comforts and empowers believers. It is the Holy Spirit mentioned in Genesis as "ruah", the breath of life; it is the Holy Spirit who inspired the authors of the books of the Bible; it is the Holy Spirit, who in the presence of the husband and wife may bring new life into the world; it is the Holy Spirit who is called upon at the Epiclesis of the Consecration of the bread and wine during Mass; it is the Holy Spirit who bestows upon us the gifts of wisdom/understanding/knowledge/ counsel/piety/fortitude and fear of the Lord and the fruits of love/joy/patience/ peace/kindness/goodness/faithfulnessgentleness, and self-control. We all receive the Holy Spirit at Baptism and have another "re-inforcement" at our Confirmation. Let us open ourselves to receive the Spirit and all of His gifts and fruits as we prepare for the upcoming Paschal Mystery.

Do you know that you will rise again? Do you know that your body is a sacramental created in the image and likeness of God? Do you know that after the Second Coming you and all others who have died will get their physical bodies back? Do you know what that physical body will look like? How about we look at Jesus' body after His resurrection? He entered locked rooms; He brought peace; He asked for something to eat; His body had a physicality in that Thomas was able to place his hands into His wounds. Are you a doubting Thomas? Do you not realize that all who are dead will rise again? Does not the Scripture and the witness of thousands give you great hope? Does not the Shroud of Turin and the image and the blood being typed as the same as was on the true Cross and the Nails and the Crown of thorns all the same? We are to have great hope today. We are to have great 'looking forward' because of season. We are to look at the Risen Christ and thank Him repeatedly for restoring us to the possibility of eternal life and life with Him in Heavenmore than likely a physical place since we will have 'physical' bodies and they will need a place to be, i.e. the new Jerusalem, the new Heaven and the new earth promised in Scripture. Let us all rejoice and be glad because Christ has risen!!!! Alleluia!!!


