Reading II: I Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20

The Gospel: Luke 6: 17, 20-26

We just celebrated Valentine's day, and as such probably celebrated some type of loving sign and gift of affection for those we love. Did we consider any act of love or gift to our God? Our Lord and Savior who created us and gives us all that we need (not all that we want or desire) but all that we need to fulfill His will for us on our journey. After all, He did suffer and die for us! Can we suffer and die for Him? It may not be a physical death; it may be a death of some vice, some habit, some sinful behavior, some personality trait perhaps learned earlier in life that is no longer necessary to sustain us and may even be destructive to thriving and relationships. It may be anger; it may be resentment; it may be jealousy; it may be envy; it may be an addiction; it may be unkindness; it may be insensitivity... oh, there are so many. When these things die, whether we 'put them to death' by willing them out of our lives or they die a 'natural death' of disuse we go through a metanoia, a change of heart, a change of behavior. This process is called kenosis in Greek... an act of self-emptying... an act of emptying oneself of one's own desires and becoming entirely receptive to God's divine will, obedient to the point of death, even a martyrdom similar to Jesus and the Apostles (all but John)! As we see in Phil. 2:7 "let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who. Though He was in the form of God did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness, and being found in human form He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross. Therefore, God also highly exalted Him and gave Him the name that is above every name....

"We often assume parenthood happens easily after 'I do,' but for many married couples, it does not. For some, the joy of conception never happens. Others suffer repeated miscarriages. Still others experience secondary infertility... If you experience difficulty bringing a child into your family, know that you are not alone. God is with you, and his Church desires to walk with you... God has a beautiful plan for your life as a married couple." USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities "Seven Considerations While Navigating Infertility". While many do suffer from infertility and subfertility, many do not know of options of Restorative Reproductive Medicine (RRM) which can actually diagnose most accurately the why of lack of ability to conceive and more often than IVF and other options for pregnancy (like surrogacy/egg donation/sperm donation, etc.) correct and allow the couple to conceive. While not always successfully RRM and the Creighton model of NaPro technology (Natural Procreative technology) espoused by the Pope Paul VI institute at Creighton University. Philadelphia is blessed with two female Ob/ Gyns who practice these methods- Dr. Delia Laurriri and Dr. Monique Ruberu. Further, many others can be accessed through MyCatholicDoctor online. These specially trained physicians do their best to find the 'actual' problem with subfertility, be it in male or female, and can prescribe corrective procedures/medications to help remedy the situation. The one thing we must all keep in mind is that only God creates life- we are invite to be open to be co-creators with Him. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

Rose of Life Intention: That all married couples be open to life and love and God's plan.


