Next weekend on March 1, 2025, our Adult Faith Committee will be offering a special program on "after life" or "near death" experiences. Mike Hagan will be speaker and discuss his moving presentation on his "near death" experience and how such an event may enhance belief in the existence of an immortal soul and perfections of God's love. Mike is an active member of Our Lady of Good Counsel in Moorestown, NJ; he is a Eucharistic minister, an active Knight of Columbus, and a secular Franciscan and Medical and Humanitarian Missionary. A "near death experience" or NDA is a profound experience that some people have when they are close to death; they usually occur when someone is unconscious, comatose or clinically dead. NDE's are profound personal experiences that may reflect detachment from the body, feelings of levitation, total serenity, security, warmth, joy and sometimes the presence of light. The day begins with 8:30 AM Mass in the church followed by a light continental breakfast in the church auditorium below and Mike's presentation at 9:30 AM. Please plan on joining us. No fee; good will offering and a great precursor to the sacrificial entering of Lent the following Wednesday.

There are several training modules scheduled in the near future and he desires certain parishes to be 'hubs' of this missionary discipleship in their areas. We need to be beacons of light in the darkness; we need to venture into the darkness, but first putting on the full armor of the Lord (Eph. 6) and pray and model and invite. It can start within our own families; it can spread to work groups, parish groups, ministries of service, prayer groups, the adoration chapel...so many ways to reach out and invite our brethren who are 'away' back.



Our Outdoor Columbarium Niches located in the memorial circle in the center of our cemetery are now available for sale.

Granite Front Double Niche: A space within a columbarium designed for the entombment of two cremated remains. Double granite front niches are intended to be used by two cremated remains of two persons behind a marble shutter. Maximum usable space of 11.5 inches by 11.5 inches by 13.5 inches. The urn will not be visible. A standard plaque can be purchased for \$425 at the time of sale of the niche, or at market price at the time of interment of Cremated Remains. Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services: \$3,200 The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday - Friday: \$550 Saturday: \$700




SERVANTS OF MARY
