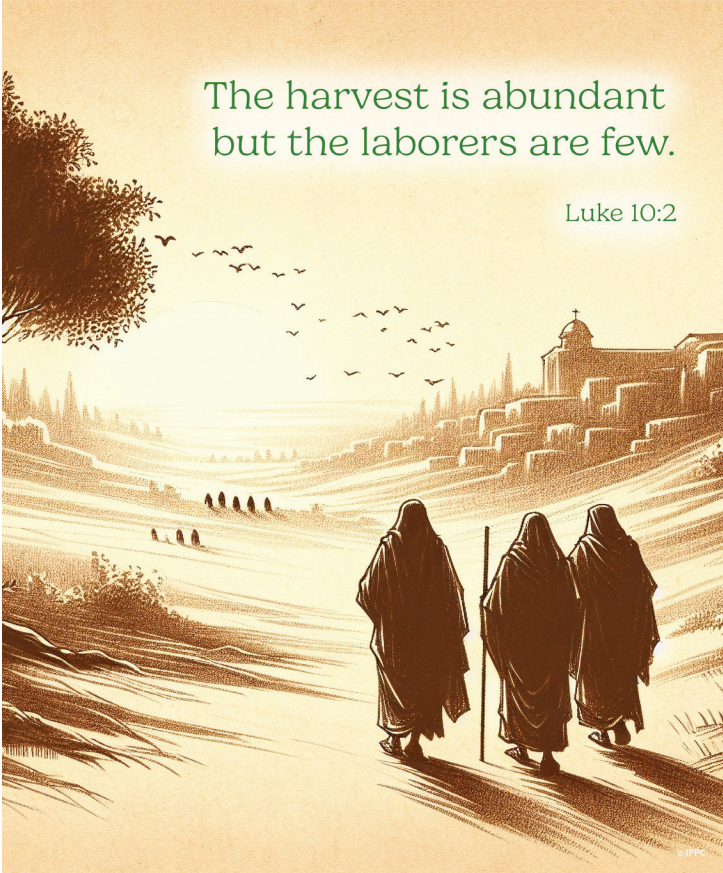

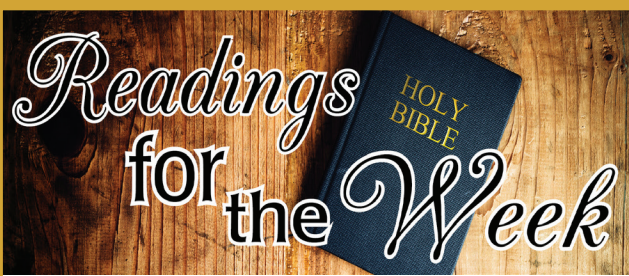

Faith Formation

July is the seventh month of the year and the fourth of seven months to have a length of 31 days. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Julius Caesar, it being the month of his birth. Monday, July 1 was the feast day of St. Junipero Serra whose statue several years ago was displaced by an angry mob in CA despite that he founded the first missions in CA to protect the indigenous people in that area against those oppressing them. July 3 was the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle- he who doubted and eventually evangelized India. July 4, the feast of St. Elizabeth of Portugal; July 6, we have the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr; July 11, the feast day of St. Benedict who founded the monastic rule and gave us the Benedictine Order; July 14, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American canonized saint; July 16, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel; July 21, St. Lawrence Brindisi, priest and doctor; July 22, St. Mary Magdalene; July 25, the feast of St. James the Apostle and the anniversary of Humane Vitae giving us Church teaching on human sexuality/contraception/ responsible parenthood and family planning; July 26, feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus; July 29, feast day of St. Martha and finally July 31, feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola. An all-star banner month, one that started with Independence Day celebrating the birth of our nation and such freedom of will and faith as manifested by the saints we celebrate.

One way to remember our departed friends and relatives may be to dedicate a visible monument to their memory. We are currently taking orders for personally inscribed bricks that will be permanently installed on the walkway to the parish grotto. Our Outdoor Columbarium Niches located in the memorial circle in the center of our cemetery are now available for sale.

Granite Front Double Niche: A space within a columbarium designed for the entombment of two cremated remains. Double granite front niches are intended to be used by two cremated remains of two persons behind a marble shutter. Maximum usable space of 11.5 inches by 11.5 inches by 13.5 inches. The urn will not be visible.

A standard plaque can be purchased for \$425 at the time of sale of the niche, or at market price at the time of interment of Cremated Remains.

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services: \$3,200

Burial rights in the niche
Perpetual care

Next weekend Fr. Charles Kennedy will be speaking at our Masses for the annual Mission Appeal. He represents Father Chuck's Challenge, an initiative celebrating the memory and ministry of Father Charles Pfeffer, a deceased beloved priest of our Archdiocese.

Over the last seventeen years, donors to Father Chuck's Challenge have provided more than 1,600 homes for desperately poor beneficiaries, previously living virtually homeless, in plastic and plank shelters, in an area frequently ravished by tropical storms – in the Northern Highlands of Nicaragua and in hurricane ravaged Haiti. 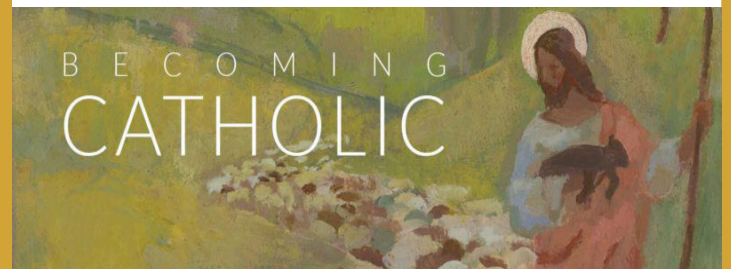
