We are about to celebrate Ash Wednesday, March 5. Ash Wednesday is always 46 days before Easter. But what is Lent? Traditionally, it is a period of penitential preparation for Easter. The season provides for a 40 day fast (Sundays are excluded) in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness before He began His public ministry. We are called to remember the love of God that is poured out through Christ Jesus on the cross in His death; and His defeat of death, sin and Satan in Christ's death and resurrections that brings Eternal Life to all of us. Everyone ages 14 and up should abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; everyone ages 18-59 should fast on these days also; some may consider not eating meat on all Fridays of Lent. Many 'give up something' like favorite foods, alcohol, smoking, screen time, social media, etc., but we can also consider doing something we don't ordinarily do like daily mass, daily Bible reading, volunteering at soup kitchen, or any other type of sacrificial offering that is meant to practice self-discipline and remember the sacrifices Jesus made. Lent is also a time for prayer and visits to the adoration chapel to spend some time getting to know Jesus better... after all, it is about relationship; how can you love someone if you don't know them? Lent ends on the eve of Holy Thursday at which time starts the Easter Triduum. Let us fast, abstain, pray, give alms, and prepare to rejoice. He is risen. It is never too late to start.

The Gospel of Life is "meant to be a precise and vigorous reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability, and at the same time a pressing appeal addressed to each person, in the name of God: respect, protect, love, and serve life, every human life! Only in this direction will you find justice, development, true freedom, peace, and happiness!" (The Gospel of Life 5). The Gospel of Life (Evangelium Vitae- Pope St. JPII, 1995) was published on the Feast of the Annunciation and is a comprehensive document setting out the teaching of the Catholic Church on the sanctity of human life and related issues including murder, euthanasia and capital punishment reaffirming the Church's stances on these issues in a way generally considered consistent with previous Church teaching. The teachings professed within the document are considered infallible by Catholic theologians as manifested through the infallibility of the ordinary and universal Magisterium. Every Catholic Bishop was surveyed and responded as to their agreement with those teachings. There is no question as to reference to documents such as this Encyclical as to what are the everlasting teachings of the Catholic Church and it would be wise for all Catholics, whether they 'think' they agree or not on these topics, to

read and reflect upon the words written by a Saint of the Church... respect for ALL life from conception to NATU-RAL death as we pray in our intercessory prayers. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

Intercessory Prayer: For each expectant mother considering abortion: May the Lord provide for her needs and give her the grace and resolve to choose life for her child, let us pray to the Lord:

Rose of Life Intention: For all life, from conception to natural death.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

Francesco de Mura Francesco de Mura was an Italian painter (1696-1782) Almost a third of his frescos were destroyed during the bombings of Monte Cassino during WWII. He depicts Christ healing the blind man. Christ is dressed in red and blue, which reveals His Divinity (heavenly blue) and His humanity (blood red). He is reaching His hand to heal the nearly naked blind man.

Even though he can barely move, de Mura shows the muscularity of the blind man, underscoring that man is made in image of God, a nod to the creation of Adam at the beginning of time. Where Adam, in his original innocence, stretched out his hand to receive the grace of life, this man can barely raise his right hand to touch Christ. Instead, Christ bends down to heal the man through His touch to restore him to his original beauty. The blind man's clothing, especially around his feet and arms, makes it seem as though he is bound and shackled until Christ sets him free. It provides a beautiful reflection for us to contemplate the ways we need the healing touch of Christ in our life. And to remember the original beauty that God created us to be.
