Reading I: Genesis 15: 5-12, 17-18

God lays Abram's uncertainties to rest by strengthening His promises with a covenant oath, as He appears amid the offerings as smoke and fire.

Reading II: Philippians 3:17-4:1; or 3:20-4:1 Paul appeals to his readers to follow his example, as he models his own life after Christ's. He further notes that Christ will transform our mortal bodies to be like His own.

The Gospel: Luke 9: 28b-36

The Transfiguration shows Christ revealing His glory to offset the shock of the first Passion prediction. The presence of Moses and Elijah testifies that Jesus will fulfill both the Law and the **Old Testament Prophets.**



St. Joseph- feast day March 19- is known to all as the foster father of Jesus and although he has no recorded speaking parts in the Bible, he 'spoke' through his actions of caring for the Holy Family and working hard to support them and risking his life and reputation to follow the directions of God through messenger angels. He is the patron saint of the Universal church and families, fathers, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen and engineers and working people. Symbols associated with him are a carpenter's square and lily symbolizing his trade and his purity. He is descended from loyal lineage in the family line of King David. March 25 is the feast of the Annunciation of Our Lord; it is one of the twelve great feasts of the church year. The day is 9 months prior to the birthday of Jesus; this day represents the feast of the conception of Jesus in the womb of Mary through the Holy Spirit upon the announcing to her of her being chosen to be the Mother of Jesus. Pope St. JP II established this date as the International Day of the Unborn Child in commemoration of the conception of Jesus. This is truly a day of commemoration and celebration. We should give thanks to Mary for her yes, thanks to the Holy Spirit for His facilitating the Incarnation and to Jesus for His becoming a human person to show us the way, tell us the Truth and be the light of the world. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

"To celebrate the Gospel of life means to celebrate the God of life, the God who gives life... In every child which is born and in every person who lives or dies we see the image of God's glory. We celebrate this glory in every human being, a sign of the living God, an icon of Jesus Christ" (The Gospel of Life 84). One of the images and discussions in Fr. Henri Nouwen's "With Burning Hearts" exegesis on the Road to Emmaus Gospel is that those disciples on the road finally recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We are all called to recognize the Jesus in others in their brokenness... regardless of whatever condition! We are ALL created in the image and likeness of God. We ALL profess that the "Holy Spirit is the Lord, the Giver of life" in our Creed. IF we believe that; IF we profess that; IF we respect that, then there should be NO question as to the dignity of the human person from conception to natural death. Yet, in this culture of moral relativism, where many 'rationalize' their own truths, their own facts... not THE Truth and facts (everyone is entitled to their own opinion, not their own facts!) many are "pro-choice" ... the actual meaning of which is...yes, all have free will to choose... even evil (see Adam and Eve in the garden!) but choosing an evil... abortion is intrinsically evil in and of itself, i.e. the very nature of the act is evil- taking a human life- but those who value and honor life need to speak up and out and affirm life as God has given it to all that exist. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.



Art In our Church



Christ and the Samaritan Woman at Jacob's Well Carlo Marrati (1625-1713)

Carlo Maratti (also known as Maratta) was the leading artist in Rome, following the death of Bernini. Many of his works can be found in churches and palaces throughout Italy and France. In this depiction of Christ meeting the woman at the well, Maratti places the woman above Christ, but leaning down.

In her hand is a rope and a water jug. She seems to be curious but somewhat condescending as she gazes at Christ. Her clothing is muted and her posture seems almost weighted down as she begins to fill her urn. In contrast, Christ appears to leap up as he points to heaven. While she laboriously attempts to fill her thirst for earthly things, Jesus knows these will never quench her desires. He is offering "living water," so she will never be thirsty again. Marrati, by painting her foot on the same step as Christ's, signals she is ready to "make the leap of faith." This Lent is a good time to review whether we are attempting time and time again to fill our jugs with those earthly things that can never satisfy. It may take a surrender of our own self-will. As St. Elizabeth of the Trinity writes of such a soul, "The lamb can lead her to the fountain of life where He wills, as He wills, for she does not look at the paths on which she is walking, she simply gazes at the Shepherd who is leading her."




