The WORD of GOD

Reading I: Amos 8: 4-7

Amos condemns the greed, dishonesty, and hypocrisy of the wealthy merchants he knows. They defraud buyers and take advantage of the poor, while outwardly seeming to follow the Mosaic Law.

Reading II: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Acting as Timothy's spiritual father, Paul tells him that he has become the second link in a chain that stretches from the Apostles. He is to pass on the priestly ministry and the apostolic faith as well.

The Gospel: Luke 16:1-13, or 10-13

The Lord's parable is all about both the urgency and the preparedness Christians need to prepare for the next world. Note that the master in the story commends his steward for his shrewdness, not his goodness. Jesus points out the folly of the Pharisees who only seek the comforts of this world.

We just celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Our Lady of the Seven Dolors, Our Lady of Piety, Mother of Sorrows all related to the seven sorrows of Mary's immaculate and holy life. Mary is usually represented in art in a mournful state, in tears, with a bleeding heart and pierced by seven daggers. Those seven sorrows are: 1. The prophecy of Simeon. 2. The flight into Egypt 3. The loss of the Christ Child in the Temple 4. Mary's meeting Jesus on the Way of the Cross 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus 6. The Piercing of the Side of Jesus with a Spear 7. The burial of Jesus. It is common for Catholics to say ONE OUR FATHER AND SEVEN HAIL MARYS FOR EACH DOLOR. This feast is the basis of devotion of the Servite Order or the Servite Friars aka as the Order of the Servants of Mary. The black scapular is representative of these sorrows. Many names are derived from this feast including Dolores, Dolorita, Lola and Pia. Let us pray to our Lady and imagine her suffering if we as parents had to endure these events for one of our children. Many parents have lost children for one reason or another; let us look and pray to Mary as she, too, lost her child who was crucified before her very eyes. Our men's program continues, but it's not too late so why not join us- we will be in the 'upper room' of the Antioch center at 7 PM with a DVD on THE CATECHISM. followed by small discussion groups.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

“Throughout salvation history, God has welcomed repentant sinners with special joy. Jesus concludes the parable of the lost sheep with these words: ‘there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance’ (Lk 15:7).”

For those of you who remember the movie Apollo 13, the space capsule was in trouble and the survival of the astronauts was tenuously in question; people around the world gathered in prayer; ten thousand or more in St. Peter's square; the capsule entered earth's atmosphere losing communication with Houston Space Command; prayer occurred around the world; as the entry completed and came out of its imposed silence, jubilation and shouts and tears of joy throughout the world- a scene 'actually' depicted by newsreels from the actual events inserted into the movie. As Luke relates in his scripture, YES, YES, and YES! We can and will survive if we pray and have others pray for us and we become 'found.' Many think they are seeking God, but, in reality, He is seeking you and has been since the Garden...just stop, turn around, He is right behind you! AND in the ADORATION CHAPEL!! Pray for an end to the 'ills' of our culture and the attacks on family/marriage and children, and the end of the war in Ukraine and Middle East and world peace.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Dear Parishioners,

These are exciting times at St. Ignatius of Antioch! After much planning, discussion and review, our leaders have identified important projects that will strengthen our parish for generations to come:

- Replace the church roof to protect our worship space and ensure the safety and longevity of our parish home.
- Replace our school windows to create a more comfortable, energy-efficient environment for our students to learn and grow in faith.
- Replace our church HVAC system to provide a comfortable and reliable environment for worship, gatherings, and parish activities.

We want to hear from you before we determine the next steps. Starting Sept. 29, we will begin a comprehensive survey of our parish community. The survey, part of a parish-wide planning study, will provide our leaders with valuable feedback about the proposed projects and the possibility of a major fundraising effort. We hired the Steier Group, a Catholic fundraising firm, to conduct the study. I know many of you have questions, so here are a few of the most common ones about the planning study process and what it could mean for our future.

Q. What is a planning study?

A. The study gauges support for the proposed projects and for a potential major fundraising effort called a capital campaign. The study, which lasts five weeks, also will help identify possible volunteer leaders and set a financial goal should we choose to move forward with a campaign.

Q. How will the study determine whether there is support?

A. The Steier Group will survey the entire St. Ignatius community as part of the planning study. The firm will compile your feedback and present it to our parish leadership. We will then make an informed decision about the projects and a potential campaign. Hiring an experienced, professional development firm like the Steier Group ensures an effective, unbiased and successful planning study.

Q. Why should we conduct a planning study?

A. Many churches use planning studies when considering a fundraising campaign. It is a wise first step because the study provides valuable information on how everyone feels about the proposed projects and a potential capital campaign. That information also can help customize a campaign that really fits with the unique needs of our parish.

Q. What is a capital campaign?

A. A capital campaign is a fundraising effort for big projects and needs, such as major renovations, new buildings and eliminating debt. Capital campaigns fund specific projects and needs. They are not for regular, ongoing costs, such as salaries and utility bills.

Q. What do you expect of parish members during the planning study?

A. We ask only for your feedback and prayers during the study. Every parish household will receive an invitation with instructions on how to participate.

I hope this answers many of your questions and adds to your excitement for the future of St. Ignatius of Antioch. If you have additional questions, please contact me at any time.
