## Faith Formation

Lent is a time for fasting, abstinence and almsgiving. It is a time to prepare. When Christ was preparing for His ministry, He fasted in the desert for 40 days and nights. He was tempted. He resorted to the Scripture as His defense against temptation, and so we must also. While many do a fast and ‘give up something’ like candy or snacks or alcohol or other ‘liked’ foods, perhaps it may be time to do something more ‘giving’ as a ‘service’ to others or the Church. Perhaps the spiritual works of mercy may be a charitable ‘giving’ action: instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, admonishing the sinner, comforting the afflicted, forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead. We are all sinners; we need to repent; we are truly loved by God and He wishes us to return to Him and turn away from sin. Perhaps assisting with our Capital Campaign? A separate generous donation? As we turn away from things of this world, as we battle the world, the flesh, and the devil, let us turn to Him and He will give us rest. As Pope St. JP II has instructed us to ‘be not afraid’ and “put out into the deep”, let us leave our ‘comfort’ zones and do more; take a risk. Next Saturday is our Valentine’s Day event with renewal of vows for married couples at the 5:15 PM mass followed by dinner/dancing at only \$25 per person... BYOB. Join us if you will and celebrate love and life. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.



***“Married love differs from any other love in the world. By its nature, the love of husband and wife is so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with God and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being they will love and care for together.” - USCCB, Married Love and the Gift of Life***

God has lived in a loving community as the Trinity for all of eternity. We were created in the image and likeness of God to be in community. In the Garden, God stated to Adam that ‘it is not good for man to be alone’ and so He created Eve and the very first commandment He gave them was ‘to be fruitful and multiply’. Marital love and embrace mimics Trinitarian love in that the Father loves the Son so much and the Son loves the Father so much that their love becomes the Third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, the ‘Lord the Giver of life’ as we profess in the Creed; so, in the same manner the husband loves the wife and the wife loves the husband in their total self-giving that in the presence of the Holy Spirit a third person, a baby, comes into existence for all eternity. **St. Ignatius of Antioch Parish** is providing answers to the most frequently asked questions regarding the *Restoring Our Home, Renewing Our Mission* Capital Campaign

### **What is the *Restoring Our Home, Renewing Our Mission* campaign?**

*Restoring Our Home, Renewing Our Mission* is our capital campaign, designed to help the parish address its most urgent deferred maintenance needs. This includes replacing the church roof, upgrading or replacing the church HVAC system and replacing aging windows in our school.

The campaign seeks to strengthen our faith community while encouraging the sacrificial giving required to meet our needs to maintain our place of worship.

Based on the roof inspection and discussions with multiple engineers and contractors, we are estimating that we'll need to raise \$4 - \$5 million to address all of our needs. Any funds raised in excess of replacement/repair costs will support a deferred maintenance fund for the parish.

### **How accurate are the costs estimates and how will we assure that the work will be done right?**

All of the cost estimates are preliminary and were developed to support the capital campaign. In parallel with the fundraising work, we have established a Building Advisory Team comprised of parishioners with relevant professional experience. This team is providing expert guidance throughout the process.

### **If we raise enough money to address some or all of these needs, when would construction work begin?**

Our formal fundraising push will last through May 2026. Construction will begin once we have sufficient funds, with priority given to starting work on the church roof promptly.

### **How can we know how the church will use the gifts made to the capital campaign?**

All funds given to this campaign are restricted to the goals outlined in the campaign.

### **To what extent are campaign commitments tax deductible?**

Gifts to the campaign are tax-deductible. Donors are encouraged to consult their tax professionals.

### **How does the capital campaign affect the annual appeal and regular offertory giving?**

The campaign addresses significant deferred maintenance costs above and beyond regular giving. The annual appeal and offertory giving are budgeted to address the everyday operational needs.

### **What percentage does Steier Group receive to help us manage this campaign?**

Steier Group, our development consulting partner, does not receive a percentage of funds raised. They receive a flat weekly fee for their services. An anonymous donor has pledged to pay their costs. Therefore, all funds pledged by parish families will be used for the proposed projects.

### **How can I support the campaign?**

In early March, you will receive an appeal packet with more information and a letter from Father with a specific request to consider. These amounts are not expectations, but invitations to discern a meaningful pledge.
